

## Human Anatomy

There are several features of human anatomy that are distinct from the other warm-blooded races. The human brain has a more folded structure and greater blood supply than in comparable animals. Since this is only part of the body that has a reasonably thick coat of hair it is possible to infer that the human body requires a more exact thermal regulation than most other creatures.

Lower in the skull the structure of the jawbone and teeth are neither carnivorous nor herbivorous in nature since there is a lack of either large canines or grinding molar teeth. The contradictions continue when the digestive system is examined, as this seems typical of a carnivorous species. Perhaps because of this, in locations where the diet is rich, humans are prone to obesity. The most unusual feature of the human torso are the large scapula or shoulder blades.

Like most exothermic creatures, humans are viviparous in nature.
